News from the Council

October has seen Council embark on two significant projects

- i. This project is designed to strengthen the relationships between our member Churches and Council. Standing Committee is doing this via two activities:
 - a. Past President Bishop Peter and Executive Officer Rev Ian are undertaking trips to the regional centres of Victoria to engage with the senior leaders of churches in those regions
 - b. President Fr Shenouda and Executive Officer Rev Ian are meeting with the Metropolitan church leaders
- ii. The second project is that the Standing Committee has engaged the services of an experienced facilitator Mr Phil McCredden to help the Standing Committee navigate the way forward and set priorities for 2020 and beyond. The findings will be shared with the wider Council in early 2020.


Approximately 300 properties were visited over five days with 40 VCC EM volunteers providing psychological first aid and emotional spiritual care support where needed.




Anglican and Roman Catholic Prayer for reconciliation - Melbourne

On the 22nd of October the nation marked the first anniversary of the National Apology to Victims and Survivors of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse.

At our recent Safer Churches conference we were lucky to hear from keynote speakers Julie Blyth, former clinical advisor on the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Sexual Abuse and Craig Hughes Cashmore, CEO of SAMSN and survivor himself.

Both Craig and Julie reminded us about the journey of healing for survivors and how vitally important it is that we “*listen deeply into someone’s story*”. It is the Church’s role to ensure people are truly and deeply heard. “We need the kind of rituals that help bring healing.”

Palestine Israel Ecumenical Network



In recent weeks there have been three significant announcements by church denominations within Africa and the USA to support the international non-violent Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement, to end Israel's military occupation of Palestine.

The Southern African Anglican Church Provincial Synod, the Methodist Church of Southern Africa and most recently, the Episcopal Church in the USA, all took steps toward actively engaging with the illegal occupation by showing solidarity to Palestinian civil society and Palestinian Christians, to support their call to BDS. It is noteworthy that South African churches have taken this step, given their firsthand experience of what apartheid looks like and what was needed to end it, in their circumstance. The Synod noted in their resolution that "There are possible similarities between Apartheid in South Africa and what is happening in Israel and Palestine and that in some respects the situation there can be described as worse than apartheid".

Australian churches and Christians from most denominations spoke out about the injustices faced by black South Africans during the apartheid era and lent their support to the non-violent anti-apartheid sanctions. So the question is, why isn't the same being done for Palestine?!

With Christmas just around the corner, now is the time to think about where products were made and who they support.

Sister Pat Fox joined the Sisters of Sion congregation in 1969. After some years in the church, she studied law and worked at the Footscray Community Legal Centre, Legal Aid and Broadmeadows Community Legal Centre.



She came to national prominence in November 2018, when she was deported from the Philippines for her role in documenting human rights violations, after having come to the attention of President Duterte,

Sister Fox first went to the Philippines in 1990. During her time in the country, she was active in the Diocesan Justice and Peace Group, as well as serving as both the Central Luzon co-ordinator and National co-ordinator of the Rural Missionaries of the Philippines. As a volunteer with the National Agricultural Workers Union, she helped document human rights violations as a result of the imposition of martial law in the Mindanao region in the south of the Philippines.


The true story of a whistleblowing cop who took on corruption and the Church

All that is necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing.'

Former Detective Chief Inspector Peter Fox is a hero in many people's eyes. A police officer with 36 years' service in the Hunter region, he rose to national prominence in 12 for his major role in speaking out for the victims of abuse within the church. He had been at the coalface fighting these heinous crimes for decades. He had worked with the victims and supported their families. He knew an enquiry was long overdue. His decision to become a whistle blower helped trigger Prime Minister Julia Gillard's historic decision to establish a far-reaching Royal Commission into the sexual abuse of children in institutions.

He had no idea what speaking up would unleash. Peter's dedication and focus cost him his career, his health and also affected his wife's health. He and his family were threatened. Former friends shunned him. But the victims and the families that he supported consider him their champion. To them he is a hero.

WALKING TOWARDS THUNDER details the cumulative horrors our police face every day, it reveals the cover ups and the way sexual predators were moved around. It shows the backlash he faced and the lengths those in power will go to avoid facing the truth. Confronting and inspiring, this is an unforgettable story.

PNG Government Pressures the Australian Government to remove Refugees from Manus Island

The Uniting Church and its members and supporters, such as yourselves, have advocated for an end to offshore processing of people seeking asylum in Australia. In late July, the new government in Papua New Guinea called for the "full closure" of the asylum seeker process on Manus Island. Manus province Governor, Charlie Benjamin, said all the refugees should be resettled elsewhere as soon as possible. He pointed out they had been at the facilities for seven years.


